TORONTO (November 12, 2020) – The Hockey Hall of Fame is pleased to announce that **“THE HALL – HOCKEY’S TREASURE”** will air on TSN at **7:00 PM (EST) on Tuesday, November 17, 2020** (with encore broadcasts on TSN5 at 11:00 PM (EST) on November 17, 2020 and 2:00 PM (EST) on November 18, 2020).

Hosted by TSN’s James Duthie, this one-hour special takes an inside look at how the Hockey Hall of Fame has been impacted by the coronavirus pandemic and other topical themes featuring conversations with Chairman, **Lanny McDonald**, Vice-President & Curator, **Phil Pritchard**, and Honoured Member (Class of 2016), **Eric Lindros**. The show wraps up with reactions from the six inductees of the **Class of 2020** to a virtual reveal of their tribute plaques in the Esso Great Hall. As confirmed on October 29th, **Ken Holland, Marian Hossa, Jarome Iginla, Kevin Lowe, Kim St-Pierre** and **Doug Wilson** will be formally honoured as a stand-alone class during the Hall’s *2021 Induction Weekend/Celebration* (scheduled for November 12-15, 2021).

“THE HALL – HOCKEY’S TREASURE” will coincide with the launch of the **“Hockey Hall of Fame Legends Line Auction”**, a fundraising initiative via **NHL Auctions** in support of the Hockey Hall of Fame’s COVID-19 relief and recovery efforts.
